Ideas for Developing Independence


- Encourage your child to communicate directly with the teacher for day-to-day questions, such as scheduling a make-up test, submission questions, etc.
- Parents contact the teacher if it is a serious matter, such as personal conflicts, philosophical concerns, content/pacing questions, etc.

The First Semester: Stay Involved!

- Expect the first few months of school to be a period of adjustment.
- Make sure your child is completing homework and is clear about deadlines.
- Regularly check binder for stray papers/ missing work
- Give reminders. Do you have all your homework in your backpack? Are your PE clothes ready? Do you have your lunch? Do you have a book to read if you finish assignments early?

- Encourage your child to take ownership of grades.





Submitted electronically & in Print Students will learn and effectively use the Google platform.






